Alumnae in the San Francisco area have always held dinner gatherings in the past, but this year, following the footsteps of Toronto, Vancouver, Southern California (based in Los Angeles), and Sydney, the fifth overseas chapter of the AA is set up. This is indeed another strong act of how overseas alumnae have supported our school, and enacted the most cherished line in our School Song: Though we are far away, our hearts will never leave.

On Monday 19 October 2015, a dinner gathering was held in honour of Ruth Lee ('72), the recently retired principal of YW at the May Flower Restaurant in Milpitas, California.



There were two tables of alumnae, family, and two former teachers Miss Wong Pui Yin and Mrs Chong Chan Yee Wan. Ruth gave a Powerpoint presentation on the latest news of the school, and the fundraising efforts in support of school redevelopment. Thanks to everyone's generosity, and the tremendous efforts of the organizers, a total of US\$1,500 was raised in that evening.

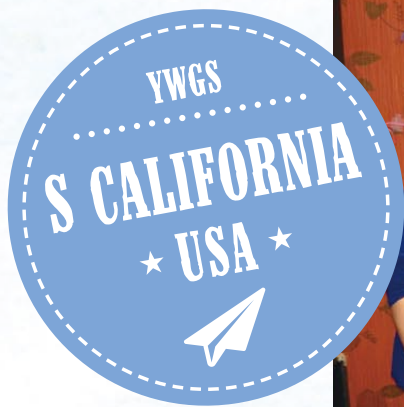
但目前還未有享用這禮物的適當人選呢！

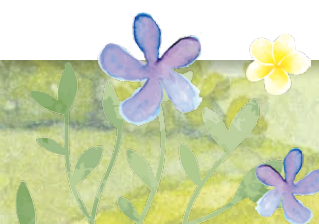

《三城記》的故事從40年代開始描述中國大陸情境，戰爭的殘暴和一對男女在亂世的遭遇，他們忠於浪漫的愛情，勇敢面對困難，很使人感動！有些場面年青一輩的會認為誇大，其實是真實不過，有血有淚！我回憶於1942年香港淪陷後北上「貴陽」學校應聘，途經「獨山」的火車站時，看見有很多要逃離往大後方的人羣。幸運買得車票的列隊上車，不久就見四方的難民擁前來搶著登車，車站人員阻擋不住，有些人就給錢與鄉民，幫忙「托起」他們從窗口爬入。逃難的混亂情況與所看的電影雖是小巫見大巫，但同樣是「求生」所驅使。婉婷能將故事用很有高低潮的手法介紹出來，難能可貴。那電影是長了些，但作為觀眾的我很耐心地見證故事的發展，更慶幸那對患難同命鴛鴦有好的結果，獲上天賜給一個有才華、事業成功、享譽世界的兒子成龍！



我很欣賞那對演員劉青雲和湯唯的超卓演技，亦使我憶起婉婷的著名創作 -- 《秋天的童話》，很溫馨，忘不了「船頭尺」的演員周潤發。目睹婉婷的藝術才華不斷增長，覺得很符合英華校歌「爾諸生其作光而無休」的訓勉呢！

We have done it in Vancouver, Alaska, Toronto, Sydney, etc. We have hiked, gone sightseeing, shopped, shared good food, and exchanged stories of our life experiences. Why not just meet again in Hong Kong? After all, we grew up together during Miss Silcocks' headmistress-ship. In October 2015, 27 classmates of which 11 from Hong Kong, 5 from the US, 4 from Australia and 7 from Canada participated in our 7-day reunion in Hong Kong (with 3 of them joining through Skype from Canada).
